Ship Wreck

A ship wreck differs in a number of ways from a train wreck. First, and most frightening to most of us is that it takes place on water. Now I love the water and I'm quite comfortable in water to a point. But I don't live in water. I'm not a fish. So if the ship I'm traveling on sinks, eventually I sink unless there is something

else that can keep me afloat. So when we think of life situations that are like a ship wreck, we are talking about monumental events that generally affect a lot of people and put us into very unfamiliar territory. Another difference between a train wreck and a ship wreck is the duration and the amount of warning. Train wrecks



seem to happen quickly with little warning. We likely didn't see it coming and once its here we are either powerless to change course or don't have enough time to do so.

Ship wrecks usually unfold over a longer period. A storm is seen over the horizon but it could dissipate or move a different direction. The wind changes and we need to change course if not change our destination. We have choices to make. Some of our choices could save the day. Poor choices could make matters worse.

When I think of present day ship wrecks that seem to be unfolding in our midst I think of our political circumstances, particularly on the national level. With a mid-term election coming up it is no surprise this is on my mind. My in-box is full of emails making political claims. Too many of them are unsettling, intended to create fear and a sense of urgency to cast my vote their way. But as I stand back a bit what I see is an impending ship wreck that has been unfolding with each wave and exasperated by each passing storm. I have come to realize that ship wrecks don't always happen. Situations change and momentum can shift in favorable ways.

Ship wrecks are those monumental that unfold over a period of time...

Within this national ship wreck concern is our beloved city and neighborhood. National politics aside Flint has been in the midst of a ship wreck that could be described as our ship going aground and helpless to move in any direction. While I don't ordinarily subscribe to this extreme I can see how after decades of further decline we certainly have not been "underway" at cruising speed in a very long time. Perhaps the problem is not our circumstances. Perhaps the problem is that our destination has changed but we are still holding onto an old itinerary. Like train wrecks, scripture also offers examples of ship wrecks that offer incite and wisdom.

The story from the Book of Acts about the Apostle Paul's trip to Rome is a story of adventure and intrigue. On Paul's way to his destiny he encountered waypoints or intermediate stopovers. Places that he visited before his journey could continue. Dry land, perhaps, but unfamiliar dry land, with unfamiliar circumstances. Yet familiar needs.

Paul found himself on just such a journey. Departing his homeland for Rome his ship encountered one obstacle after another. Paul was neither the Captain nor the Pilot. He lived at the mercy of others who put their own lives ahead of his but who knew how to navigate the sea yet incapable of controlling the sea. Paul was not silent in his captivity. He ministered to the people that he traveled with offering encouragement and eventually hope for their own survival. Caught in storms

and desperate to find safe harbor the crew eventually wrecked close enough to the Island of Malta to be saved. Once there, Paul made the best of it. He ministered to the local residents, healing their sick and sharing the Gospel.

I beg you, take courage! Not one of you will lose your life...For last night an angel of the God to whom I belong and whom I worship came to me and said, "Don't be afraid, Paul...So take courage, for I trust in God that it will be just as I was told".

Acts 27:22-25 GNT

Paul had discerned that he was being called to Rome to take the Good News there but Paul had learned that faithfulness requires patience which requires a trust in God's ability to navigate storms even during times when hope is harder to find. Perhaps Paul was certain that spending time in Malta was part of God's plan. Perhaps Paul knew that even if nature or human incompetence had temporarily delayed the unfolding of God's plan that God would make the best of it and that there was work to be done while waiting.

Whether you find yourself recovering from a train wreck, trying to avoid a train wreck, or if you are in the midst of what appears to be a certain ship wreck, unfolding in slow motion, but leaving you feeling powerless, God's plan continues to unfold. And if all of these wrecks are too many metaphors, let them go.

Bur remember this — God has a plan for our wellbeing...but FIRST we may experience setbacks and downright failures along the way. Whether these were always a part of God's plan or simply the enemy adding to our difficulty, God's plan will prevail. Meanwhile, there is always work to be done, for the Good News of Jesus Christ never gets old or out of date. For there is power in His name that will heal and transform people, neighborhoods and cities.

What work has God given you to do at whatever waypoint you find yourself?

The argument is powerful and I've heard this argument from well meaning, somewhat angry Christians in the past. "I know what to do because it says so in the Bible!" Yes it does but be careful not to read with tunnel vision

Most important, salvation, and by salvation I mean the Good News that comes to us right now, right where we are, without so much as changing our socks, is a gift. Salvation is not given to us because of anything we have done, or not done, or anything that we intend to do. Salvation is ours because of what Christ has already done. We don't earn salvation. The Good News is a free gift. We just have to accept it.

Martha, Martha! You are worried and troubled over so many things, but just one is needed. Mary has chosen the right thing, and it will not be taken away from her.

Sounds easy doesn't it? And it is easy. Jesus said so. In Matthew 11:30 Jesus tells us that the load that He puts on us is light — not heavy. Furthermore, in Psalm 37 God promises to give us the desires of our heart. Why? Because God loves us and lived among people to show us just how much we are loved even before we take our first breath and certainly before we quote our first verse of Scripture.

we were toddlers it is hard to surrender our own desires. And we are masters of justifying that our desires are what God wants.

You say "But pastor, didn't you say that God would give us the desires of our heart? Well I desire ." We fill in the blank with what we believe to be true about ourselves without really knowing ourselves. At least not as well as Jesus knows us. We assume that we know exactly what we need.

Our thoughts go something like "Lord just let me do what I like doing and I will consider giving You the credit." 

The closest they could come was to stand outside the door. Have you ever stood outside a door when there was something going on inside? How did you feel? What kept you from going in?

you feel like you are falling further behind? These are questions that according to the author of our next book could be proceeded with "You may be a Martha if..." Perhaps you not a Martha-type. Instead of busyness

that never ends you take time to "smell the roses" and talk to strangers and manage to be the target of rolling eyes and harsh comments about not doing your share of the chores. Well, "You might be a Mary if..."

On Wednesday, October 31, we begin our next book titled *Having a Mary Heart in a Martha World*. Mary and Martha are named in the Gospels in three places: Luke

One thing is clear in terms of their type-casting, Mary is not Martha and Martha is not Mary. They are two very different people who both want to know and serve Jesus Christ.

This study offers an invitation for every one of us who feels like we just aren't godly enough... or loving enough... or that we just aren't doing enough. Our lives today really are not all that different from that of Mary and Martha in the New Testament. Like Mary, don't you also long to sit at the Lord's feet... but the daily demands of a busy world just won't leave you alone? Like Martha, don't you love Jesus and really want to serve Him... yet don't you often struggle with weariness, resentment, and feelings of inadequacy?

Just like the story told by Luke, Jesus comes right into the midst of your busy Mary/Martha life and extends the same
