Frankly, since human words are often more mean than meaningful, we often have trouble listening to each other. Our listening skills are particularly compromised when we don't want to hear what's being said or we're too busy to pay attention.

Psychiatrist Morgan Scott Peck offers this insight in his best-selling book, *The Road Less Traveled*, "You cannot truly listen to anyone and do anything else at the same time."

But the truth is we' re often busy multitasking: texting, checking our email, surfing the internet, or planning what we will say while the other person is talking, or what we will do once the conversation ends.

Our current worship series is titled *Words*. While not all communication requires them, the words we speak or write are powerful. And so are words we don't say or write.

In this week's chapters from Woman of Words, the Temple police arrest Mary and Matthew. They bring Matthew before Theophilus, the High Priest, who warns him to stop assisting Mary with writing the stories of Yeshua. They bring Mary before the former High Priest, Annas, who Nicodemus warned was the real power broker behind the scenes.

In a show of power, Annas reads aloud excerpts from stolen manuscripts, shedding light on what happened to the missing stories.

Mary tells Annas her Son is the Messiah. When questioned how she was so certain, she shared how an angel told her what was to happen before Yeshua's birth. Her Son had no earthly father, for He was the Son of God.

After Matthew's release, he shares these thought while observing the people going about their day's busyness. "Outside the Temple, righteous Israel was on full display in the blue robes of the Pharisees, the richly embroidered garments of the Sadducees, and the spotless white robes of the Essenes... Mingling among these pictures of piety were ordinary people like me and Peter and Marythose who knew they were sinful creatures but who wanted to please HaShem [God] above all else...These were the wounded our Messiah came to redeem, and they were the people for whom Mary and I were writing."

Matthew's musing sets up the irony of Mary's arrest ordered by Annas, who also was the first to question her Son after His arrest. "How do you know this?" was the High Priest's question after Mary told Him that Yeshua is the Messiah. "I' ve seen Him," Mary replied.



I have often thought of creating a worship series based on one or more Hallmark movies. After all, many of their themes remind me of the ups and downs of many stories found in scripture.

Christmas is a time of anticipation. Most of us have preferences for how the season should play out based on imperfect memories of past holidays. And although we can picture the expected outcome, life happens in ways we had not anticipated.

Welcome to our series *Letters*. If you prefer books to movies, I encourage you to read along with me as our imagination wanders from the pages of Nancy Naigle's book to ancient times, when persons and communities also faced life-altering decisions.

Weeping we sat beside the rivers of Babylon thinking of Jerusalem.

Psalm 137:1

Of course, the movie, *Christmas in Evergreen: Letters to Santa*, is available from the Hallmark Channel if this is your media of choice.

As I searched through Hallmark's library, reading dozens of summaries, Babylon kept popping up in my subconscious. In scripture, Babylon is a city, a region, and an empire. Most of all, Babylon is a place of exile.

Abram and Sarai, better known as Abraham and Sarah, were originally from Babylonia. It was in Babylon that the community attempted to build a tower tall enough to reach heaven. The people of Judea were exiled in Babylon.

As with most movies, biblical stories are about specific people. While, at the same time, the stories reveal things about ourselves. We're not only invited to take on roles as we experience the story, we are the story.

As the daughter of military parents, Lisa Palmer lived an unsettled life. And as an adult, she wanted to return to Evergreen, the town where she was born, to spend Christmas. Lisa's family left Evergreen when she was seven. Before her family left, Lisa put a letter to Santa in the box at Daisy's General Store asking that she could spend every Christmas in Evergreen. Daisy, the store owner, suggests she make a slight, but subtle change to her letter that every year be "like" Christmas in Evergreen.

Reluctantly, he agrees, although the two face numerous complexities. For one, Gaius Caesar, more commonly known as Caligula, decides to raise a statue of himself in the Holy Temple. And he is willing to kill every man in Israel if needed.

Matthew's attention turns to saving his people. Meanwhile, Mary encourages him to come to terms with his past. When they finally near the completion of their project, Matthew realizes that the job he reluctantly accepted might be his God-given destiny.

Although Hunt's book is fictional, her attention to details in scripture challenges our knowledge of the Bible. With each character, we meet the questions that percolate inside us. What parts of her description are likely genuine, and which are made up?

Angela Hunt has published over 100 books, selling nearly 5 million copies worldwide. Angela, a New York Times bestselling author, received the Times Book Club Lifetime Achievement Award in 2006. She has a Ph.D. in biblical studies in theology and is well-versed in biblical text. Angela can be found online at www.angelahuntbooks.com. Our Book Club does not meet as a group. 
